### Setting the Scene

The Youngstown State women's basketball team begins its second season on Monday when it takes on familiar postseason foe Wright State at the Nutter Center. The 10th-seeded Penguins and No. 7 Raiders will meet in the tournament for the fourth time in nine seasons. Wright State has won all three previous meetings. The winner of Monday's game will play at No. 2 Butler on Wednesday.

### A Quick Look at the Penguins

YSU has opened the year with 29 losses with much of blame placed on playing shorthanded. Three of YSU's seven newcomers are out for the year with an injury, and another is out while meeting academic requirements. YSU has dressed a maximum of eight players and has been down to seven 10 times. YSU has shot under 32 percent in 12 of its last 17 games and scored under 50 points in 12 of its last 15 games. Freshman Brandi Brown was named to the Horizon League All-Newcomer Team after posting 14 double-doubles and a league-leading 10.8 rebounds per game during the regular season.

### Scouting Wright State

Wright State is the No. 7 seed in the tournament by virtue of owning the tiebreaker with Valparaiso (No. 8) and Milwaukee (No. 9). The Raiders lost their last two contests to Cleveland State and Detroit, and their last win came over YSU on Feb. 25. LaShawna Thomas ranks 15th in the league in scoring (11.5 ppg), and Kanisha Ward's 2.5 steals per game earned her a spot on the all-defensive team.

**This Season at Wright State**

**Jan. 30, 2010 • L, 31-65:** Wright State scored 19 straight points early in the second half and had 32 points off of YSU's 31 turnovers in a 65-31 win.

YSU led 22-20 with 3:28 remaining in the first half but hit just two field goals the rest of the game.

The Penguins set school records for fewest points in a game (was since broken at Valparaiso on Feb. 13, 2010 - 28) and fewest points in a half (nine).

Maryum Jenkins and Kaitlyn March scored seven points apiece, and Brandi Brown grabbed 14 boards. Ta-myra Davis scored a 18 points on 8-for-10 shooting and grabbed 10 rebounds for Wright State

The first half went back-and-forth until Wright State scored the final nine points over the final three minutes to go into the locker room ahead 29-22. YSU led 7-2 five minutes into the game. After a spell where the Penguins hit five out of seven shots to go up 18-16, they hit three of their final 26 attempts.

YSU was outscored 36-9 in the second half. Kenya Middlebrooks went 4-for-4 from the free-throw line and extended her streak to 25 straight free throws.

**Last Game • L, 39-73 at Milwaukee**

Brandi Brown notched her 14th double-double and added seven steals in the regular-season finale as YSU lost 73-39 at Milwaukee on Saturday.

Brown finished with 12 points and 16 rebounds to go with her seven steals. Amanda Viehauser countered with 16 points and 11 rebounds for UWM.

The Panthers opened up the second half on an 11-2 run, and Youngstown State went without a field goal for nearly 11 minutes as UWM built a 52-28 lead. The Panthers outscored YSU 38-16 in the second half after the deficit was 35-23 at halftime.

YSU shot 19.4 percent for the game (13-for-67) and 4-for-26 from 3-point range.. Milwaukee made 29-for-60 for 48.3 percent.

YSU had 15 steals as a team and forced Milwaukee into 22 turnovers.

**Brown Named to Horizon League's All-Newcomer Team**

Freshman Brandi Brown has been named to the Horizon League All-Newcomer team in a vote of coaches, sports information directors and media representatives from the league, the conference announced on Sunday.

Brown was the only player in the Horizon League to average a double-double during the regular season with 11.6 points and 10.8 rebounds. She led the league with her 14 double-doubles and 10.8 rebounds per game, and she led all true freshmen in scoring.

Brown finished second in the vote for Newcomer of the Year to Yar Shayok, a redshirt freshman from Detroit who averaged 11.7 points and 9.7 rebounds.

Brown is the fifth Youngstown State player to be named to the Horizon League's All-Newcomer Team since the school joined the conference prior to the 2001-02 season. She joins Jen Perugini (2001-02), Lauren Branson (2004-05), Heather Karner (2006-07) and Tiara Scott (2007-08).

**Wright State Has Been Tourney Nemesis**

The Penguins are 1-8 all-time in the Horizon League Tournament. Of their eight losses in postseason play since joining the league in 2001-02, three have been to Wright State. YSU picked up its first win in the tourney in 2008-09 when it defeated Detroit 65-54 in a first round game. YSU has also been eliminated twice by Butler and once each by Green Bay, Loyola and Milwaukee.

**Brown is First Freshman at 300 Points in 15 Years**

With 19 points against Detroit on Saturday, YSU freshman Brandi Brown became the first Penguin freshman to reach 300 points since 1994-95. Ann Marie Martin and Caroline McCombs both surpassed 300 points that season, and McCombs' 346 points is the YSU freshman record. Brown currently has 338 points, which means she'll need 10 points against Wright State to break McCombs' record. Brown has already smashed the freshman rebounding record by 75.

**Brown Surpasses 300 Rebounds**

With 16 rebounds against Milwaukee on Saturday, Brandi Brown became the third player in school history to grab 300 rebounds in a season. Wanda Grant and Dorothy Bowers both grabbed at least 300 twice in their careers, but Bowers is the only YSU player to do it at the Division I level (326 in 1985-86, 325 in 1987-88). Bowers is the only women's basketball player to have her number retired at YSU.

**Brown Can Play Defense, Too**

Brandi Brown showed off her defensive prowess on Saturday as well as she finished with seven steals against Milwaukee. Six of those came in the first half. Brown's seven steals were the most in a game since Brianne Kenneally had seven versus Cleveland State in 2000. Brown has a team-high 49 steals, which is eight more than Macey Nortey's second-place 41. Brown ranks seventh for steals by a freshman in

**Trying to Avoid a Winless Season**

Youngstown State will have its final shot at a win for the 2009-10 season against Wright State on Monday. If the Penguins falter, they will become the ninth women's team to go winless for a season in the past 10 years, according to STATS LLC.

**All Returners Set Highs in Scoring**

With Kaitlyn March's 21-point game on Feb. 27, all five of Youngstown State's returners have set a new career high in points for a season. Rachael Manuel (143) and Kenya Middlebrooks (135) have made the biggest jumps. Below is a chart comparing scoring totals of last season to this season for YSU's five returners.

**March Ties 3-Pointers Record on Memorable Senior Day**

Senior guard Kaitlyn March saved the best game of her career for her final contest at Beeghly Center. March scored a career-high 21 points in the contest against Detroit and tied a school record with seven 3-pointers. March was 7-for-13 from 3-point range, becoming the eighth player in school history to make seven treys. She became just the fourth player to hit seven threes at Beeghly Center. March had her second double-digit scoring game of the season on Saturday at Milwaukee with 11 points.

**Nortey Reaches 200 Career Assists**

Through 59 games in her young career, sophomore point guard Macey Nortey has 208 assists. She had 80 last year, and she's posted 128 through 29 games in 2009-10. Her 80 assists last year ranked sixth on YSU's freshman record list, and her 128 this year rank fifth on the sophomore list. Nortey's 208 assists are the fourth-most by a Penguin in her first two seasons. Only Dianne Rappach (246), Margaret Peters (233) and Caroline McCombs (229) have had more.

**Manuel, March Wrapping Up Careers**

Seniors Rachael Manuel and Kaitlyn March are playing the final regular-season game of their careers today against Milwaukee.

Manuel is having the best year of her career by far, averaging career highs in almost every offensive category. She has more than doubled her career scoring total from her first three years combined with 188 points, and her 142 rebounds are nearly double her career total entering this year. She is in her second year at YSU after transferring from Southern Miss.

March is a fourth-year senior, but she's accrued most of her statistics in her last two years. She scored 59 points in 23 games last year after having nine points in 14 games combined in her first two seasons. This year, on the heels of a 21-point effort against Detroit on Feb. 27, she has 70 points in 26 games.

**Looking for Solid Starts on the Road**

YSU has struggled out of the gate on the road for the last two-and-half months of the season. Through 15 minutes, YSU has trailed by at least 15 in eight of its last 11 road contests dating back to Dec. 13, 2009. YSU has been down 21 or more in four of its last six road games through 15 minutes. The Penguins were tied with Wright State on Jan. 30.

**Big Runs Have Been Costly**

State has allowed its opponents to go on runs of at least 10-0 at some point during the game. YSU was leading Loyola, Valparaiso and Green Bay at home before the big runs. Valpo went on a 22-0 run in the second half on Feb. 13, which was the biggest run by a league opponent this year. Detroit went on a 15-0 run in the first half on Feb. 27 to turn a 24-22 lead into a 39-22 advantage. Green Bay scored the first 14 points of the game on Thursday, and Milwaukee went on a 15-0 run late in the second half on Saturday.

Opponents Succeeding in the Paint

With Youngstown State having only two healthy players taller than 5-foot-8, opponents have been able to create a big scoring advantage in the paint. YSU has been outscored 1,096-486 in the paint for an average difference of 21 points per game. YSU has been outscored in the paint in 28 of the first 29 games.

Why Only Eight Players?

After signing day on April 15, 2009, the Penguins had a full roster of 15 (seven returners and eight newcomers). Since then, the following players have not been available for various reasons: *Camisha Alexander* (would have been top returning scorer) - left the university in May; *Brooke Conley* - JUCO transfer who did not qualify academically; *Casey Jackson* - early signee who left the university the second day of the fall semester; *Tieara Jones* - JUCO transfer who did not qualify academically and is still on the team; *Shea Johnson* - injured back (unknown return); *Melissa Thompson* - injured knee (out for year); *Kaitlin Rohrs* - shin splints (unknown return). Of the original eight newcomers, only three have played.

Brown Breaks Freshman Rebound Mark, Closing in on Scoring Record

With 14 rebounds against UIC on Feb. 6, Brandi

Brown broke YSU's freshman rebounding record. She now has 314 rebounds, surpassing Jen Perugini's mark 239 that was set in 2001-02. Brown also has a chance to break Caroline McCombs' freshman scoring record of 346 points. Brown has 337 points, which means she'll need 10 points against Wright State to pass McCombs.

Brown Assembling Notable Year

Freshman Brandi Brown has established herself as one of the elite posts in the Horizon League. She has recorded 14 double-doubles, 11 of which have come in league play. Brown leads the league with 10.6 rebounds per contest and ranks 15th in scoring. Her 11.6 points per game is the highest among the league's true freshmen. Brown also has a chance to be the first Penguin in school history to ever lead the team in scoring, rebounding and steals in the same season.

Only six other players have averaged a double-double in school history, and only former Horizon League Newcomer of the Year Jen Perugini has done it since 1992-93. Regardless of what happens today, Brown will finish the regular season averaging a double-double.

Brown, Dimitrov Among Top-Scoring Newcomers

Brandi Brown and Bojana Dimitrov continue rank among the Horizon League's top-scoring newcomers. Brown averages 11.6 points, which leads all true freshmen, and Dimitrov's 10.2 points ranks third among newcomers.

The winner of Monday's first round game will play at second-seeded Butler on Wednesday in a quarterfinal game in the tournament. Tipoff is set for 7 p.m.

### 2009-10 Highlights

Cindy Martin, a proven winner who has already helped lead rebirths for two programs in her young career, is hoping to continue YSU's turnaround during her

second season as the Penguins' head coach.

Martin, a passionate, blue-collar worker who describes herself as the most competitive person someone will ever meet, saw her squad improve drastically over the course of her first season in Youngstown. She installed her up-tempo, aggressive style of play; emphasized pressure on defense; and she implemented her Three C's to success: classroom, community and court. Most importantly, in the hardwood classroom in Beeghly Center, she was able to teach a young group of student-athletes to play the collegiate game hard for what promises to be an exciting future in Penguin Country.

Martin certainly has the resumé to orchestrate YSU's rebirth. She has been part of rebuilding processes at West Virginia University and, most recently, Indiana University of Pennsylvania (IUP). She accumulated an overall record of 70-23 and a .753 winning percentage at IUP and helped West Virginia to two postseason berths as the Mountaineers' top assistant and recruiting coordinator.

The team showed signs of the program Martin intends to create, especially down the home stretch last season. At the pinnacle of last season's development, YSU posted an emotional win over Valparaiso - a team it lost to by 43 early in the year - on senior night.

Although Martin's first squad at YSU had five active seniors, there was a definite feeling of the future on the floor. All three of Martin's recruits, all of which signed after May 1, averaged more than 22 minutes. Her first signee, Macey Nortey, was second on the team with 26.8 minutes per game and led the team in assists.

After spending four years at West Virginia, Martin earned her first job as a collegiate head coach at Division II IUP. In just three short years, Martin turned IUP into a national power. In her final season coaching the Crimson Hawks, Martin was named the WBCA 2007-08 Division II East Region Coach of the Year.
